We can always find a comment to make about the weather in this diverse and huge continent of Australia. THE 10TH **NATIONAL** **REUNION**

At the National Committee Meeting held on 2nd December, 2009 the results of the assessment of the returned Survey Forms submitted to all of our members was examined and discussed.

The National Committee agreed that there was sufficient support from our members to proceed with planning for our 10th National Reunion to be held in Maroochydore, Sunshine Coast at the end of October, 2010.

Our assessment of returned Survey Forms was that we should plan for attendance numbers similar to the 2008 Canberra Reunion but be very mindful that we could have more attendees similar to those at the 2004 Caloundra Reunion. So, reunion core event venues will be selected on the basis of being able to cater for greater numbers.

One outcome from the Reunion Survey was that a significant number of indicated attendees stated that they would indulge in DIY activities. This was interpreted that attendees would appreciate some more organised events above that in the Proposed 10th National Reunion outlined in Newsletter No. 69. The Reunion Committee will take this into account when finalising the reunion programme!

At this time we advise the following 10th National Reunion proposed details:-

Friday, 29th October, 2010

- Registration/Collection of information package
- Meet and Greet – drinks and finger food

Saturday, 30th October, 2010

- Official Dinner – an evening event with a Guest Speaker.

Sunday, 31st October, 2010

- A BBQ get-together

Monday, 1st November, 2010

- Under Reunion Committee consideration – could be organised tours.

Tuesday, 2nd November, 2010

- Being Melbourne Cup Day – consideration would need to be given to a Melbourne Cup activity!

- **Tours/Attractions**

It is proposed that local tours/attractions will be included in the program and available throughout the reunion.

- **D.I.Y. Tours**

A list of local tours/attractions is intended to be compiled so that attendees who wish to combine the Reunion with an extended stay will be able to arrange some activities to make their visit more enjoyable.

- **Accommodation**

The Reunion Committee will negotiate favourable rates with “preferred accommodation” for Reunion attendees. However, in the end, attendees will be required to make their own accommodation bookings and make the payment directly to the accommodation management for their period of booking.

- **Transport**

Transport to and from the Reunion will be the responsibility of the attendees. The Reunion Committee will endeavour to identify the available transport serving the Reunion locality and this information would be promulgated in say Newsletter No. 71 expected to be datelined 31st March 2010. Any necessary transport associated with Reunion events will be organised by the Reunion Committee and costs will be shown on the Reunion Booking Sheets.

The planning process we foresee at this time is that the Reunion Committee will have finalised the Reunion Programme by early March, 2010 and have determined costing associated with each event.

Newsletter No. 71 will be datelined 31st March, 2010 and will include the final, full 10th National Reunion Programme, together with Booking Sheets including each event cost.

It is intended that Newsletter No. 72 will be datelined 30th June, 2010 and this newsletter would contain any necessary Reunion update information.

Booking Sheets would need to be submitted no later than 30th June, 2010 together with full payment.

We will advise, in due course, a date by which attendees may cancel their booking and receive a full refund. That date of course will be affected by contractual arrangements that the Reunion Committee have to enter into.

The Reunion Committee reserves its right to cancel any or all events should this become necessary to do so for any reason.

NEW FINDS

We are always pleased to advise of some “New Finds” and we welcome them “back to the fold” and hope they will enjoy the renewed contact with old mates.

Leon Trevor Semler - served in the RAN from 28th July, 1958 to 9th June, 1964 with O/No. R54603. Initially completed his technical training at the FND ‘L’ School becoming an Electrical Mechanic (Air). In May, 1960 Leon was re-categorised as a Radio Electrical Mechanic (Air) 1st Class. A “Title Change” on 1st January, 1964 meant that Leon was then an Electrical Mechanic Air Communications i.e. EMAC.

Ian Gilmour Scott – is currently living in Wellington, New Zealand.

Ian served in the Royal Australian Naval Reserve during WW2 from 12th January, 1945 until he was Demobilised on 12th February, 1947. His O/No. was F5621 during this service.

Initially Ian served as an Ordinary Seaman until being selected for Radio Mechanic technical training at the RAN Radio School then located at HMAS Watson, South Head, Sydney. At that time comprehensive Radio Mechanic technical courses were being conducted at HMAS Watson.

We are yet to obtain further details from Ian.

We are following up on a number of leads that should locate more of our “missing” Radio Mechanics.

Please, any of our readers, if you are able to provide contact addresses, leads, names, preferably with given names/initials of “ex Radio Mechanics” please pass this information on to John Saywell - his contact details can be found at the head and tail of this newsletter. In the end, we will respect anyone’s wish as to whether or not they choose to be involved with us - we simply want to be able to make them aware that ‘we’ exist!



IN MEMORIUM

It is with regret we report the sad passing of a number of our colleagues:

- **Walter Maxwell (Max) Arnold**, on 16th July, 2009, at age 88 years whilst in hospital having had a stroke. Max served in the Australian Armed Forces during WW2, initially with the Army (Signals) in 1939 where he was a Corporal with Army Number S15976. He then joined the Royal Australian Naval Volunteer Reserve as a Telegraphist on 10th February, 1942 and was allocated O/No. PA/V50. In May, 1942 Max was selected for Radio Mechanic Technical Training – he was already fully qualified in “Civvy Street”! On completion of his training at the Melbourne Technical College he was transferred

to the Permanent RAN for “Hostilities Only” service and then was given O/No. 26225 and became a Leading Wireless Mechanic on 21st November, 1942. He was then trained in RDF (radar) technicalities at the RAN Radio School, South Head, Sydney.

Next Max was dispatched to England to join the Commissioning Crew of HMAS Shropshire (cruiser) in which he served until 20th November, 1944. Max had become a Petty Officer Radio Mechanic by this time following a Branch Name change from Wireless Mechanic Branch to Radio Mechanic Branch.

Post WW2 Max worked for a time in the RAN Radar Laboratory at Liechhardt, Sydney then in the Broadcast Station Industry followed by 19 years in the Industrial Electronics/Electronic Control industry in Sydney.

Max’s funeral service was held in the South Chapel of the Northern Suburbs Crematorium on Wednesday, 29th July, 2009.

- **Robert Edward Norman Geale** – known affectionately to all as “Windy” was born in Welland, Canada on 19th March, 1925 and was deceased in Nowra, NSW on Sunday, 6th December, 2009 at age 84 years.

During WW2 “Windy” served in the Royal Navy as a Telegraphist Air Gunner and maintained his own airborne radio equipment; as such he was a “Radio Mechanic”. Later, “Windy” married Kathleen (Kit) Ryall who was a WREN Radio Mechanic (Air).

Subsequently, “Windy” served in the Royal Canadian Navy Fleet Air Arm and later still he joined the Royal Australian Navy and served in its Fleet Air Arm. “Windy” became a Lieutenant Commander.

In recent years “Windy” was very active in support of the Fleet Air Arm Museum at Nowra where he was a Curator and Historian.

Windy was awarded Life Membership of the Fleet Air Arm Association of Australia at their Federal Council Meeting in October, 2009 in recognition of his work. However, sadly, Windy was not well enough to personally accept the award. Windy had a wealth of knowledge on Naval Aviation matters and was a friend to many!

A memorial service for “Windy” was conducted at the Fleet Air Arm Museum on Wednesday, 9th December, 2009 followed by a private burial service at the Cambewarra Cemetery.

- **Valerie Joy Gleeson** – sadly we report that Valerie passed away in hospital at Palmyra WA on 16th December, 2009 after a courageous battle with cancer lasting some 13 months. Valerie was the wife of Kevin Gleeson who referred to Val as his best mate for nearly 60 years.

A Mass of Celebration of Valerie's life was held at Our Lady of Fatima Church, Foss Street, Palmyra, WA on 21st December, 2009 followed by a burial service at the Fremantle Cemetery. May she rest in peace.

- **John Brian Hemming** – on 31st October, 2009 at home, in Cardigan, Wales at age 75 years. John joined the Royal Navy in 1952 and was a Radio Electricians Mate (Air) with O/No. L/S FX893559. He then served "On Loan to RAN" from 15th November, 1955 for 2 ½ years and was allocated O/No. A41598; during this loan service his Official Number was changed to R88043! John was promoted to A/Leading Radio Electrical Mechanic (Air) on 30th November, 1956 and reverted to the Royal Navy as from 21st May, 1958.

John had battled lung cancer prior to his decease.

- **W.J.D. Purich** – we noted in the latest issue of the NSW RSL Reveille 'Last Post' listed an REM W.J.D. Purich with O/No. of 90146. We do not have him on our "books" and have no further information. Does anyone know of him?

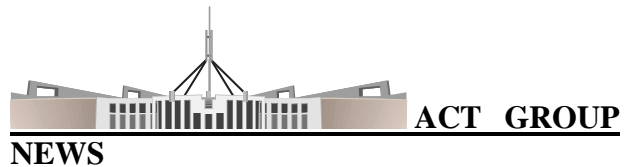

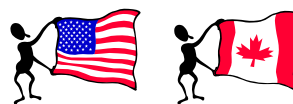

HMAS DIAMANTINA – MUSEUM SHIP, BRISBANE

YOUR HEALTH

Have you noticed the advances being made with stem cell research? Some of this research is mind-boggling!

One such line of stem cell research relates to the repair of brains damaged by strokes using adult stem cells extracted from teeth.

Associate Professor Simon Koblar, from the University of Adelaide and Queen Elizabeth Hospital, Adelaide, is leading a research project that suggests dental pulp stem cells may prove far more beneficial for brain repair than other stem cells!

The research is showing that dental pulp stem cells had a natural ability to produce and repair neurons or nerve cells and are easily extracted.

WEBSITES OF INTEREST

For some years now there has been a newsletter, titled, “Radar Returns” (Signals & Echoes for RAAF Radar Veterans). This has been a very interesting and informative newsletter and concentrated largely on WW2 experiences, recording the history while it could still be gathered from ageing veterans. In recent times the newsletter became increasingly opened up to Post WW2 aspects. The newsletter relied on a small group of people. Through lack of volunteers the October, 2009 newsletter will be the last “Radar Returns” in the printed

form! “Radar Returns” was originally launched by Peter Smith, an Ex RAAF Wing Commander and under his drive it continued until his untimely decease. Warren Mann, a WW2 RAAF veteran stepped in to keep “Radar Returns” on the go; but age was not working in Warren’s favour and due to the lack of younger volunteers (sounds familiar to us!) there will be no more “Radar Returns” in the printed form.

in which it is hoped that the spirit of “Radar Returns” will live on into the future.

The site is now publicly available through the National Library of Australia and will be regularly updated by the Australian War Memorial (AWM). The Website has ten sections including the section titled, “Newsletters” being an archive of all 40 issues of “Radar Returns” from 1995 to 2009. A comprehensive index is planned to assist future historical and genealogical researchers.

Currently, a volunteer Web Manager/Editor is being sought to assist Warren Mann (now in his upper 80s) and ultimately take over from him.
